Household Chemical Waste Includes:

Home, Garden, & Garage Chemicals: used motor oil & filters, yard & garden chemicals, antifreeze, gasoline, stain, oil-based paint, varnish, household & car batteries, cleaners, paint thinner, unwanted pills and other medications, medical needles/sharps, mercury items, compact fluorescent light bulbs & tubes, photo chemicals, pool chemicals, small 1-lb propane cylinders, adhesives, driveway sealer & more.

Items NOT Accepted:

Tires, gas grill propane tanks, ammo, fireworks, waste from businesses, & latex paint. Latex paint can be dried out and placed with regular trash; leave lid off the paint can. For tips to dry out latex paint, and proper disposal options for items not accepted at the County events, go to www.berriencounty.org/recycle.

Electronics Waste Includes:

Unwanted equipment that has a cord or is battery operated such as computers, monitors (\$10/monitor fee), televisions (\$20/TV fee), telephones, cell phones, printers, large/small appliances, window air conditioners, DVD/VCR players, power tools, dehumidifiers, cameras, etc.

Note about Electronics Recycling Fees:

TVs and computer monitors (both the tube-type and flat screen) contain toxic heavy metals, lead, and other hazardous pieces that cost a lot to handle properly. Households continuously replace unwanted TVs and monitors as new electronics quickly become available. For those reasons, along with fluctuating market prices and a decline in outlets for recycled glass, the cost for properly recycling TVs and monitors has risen sharply. In order to sustain the electronics recycling collection events for the residents of Berrien County, the recycling fee on monitors and TVs will now be \$10/monitor and \$20/television (all types). There is no fee to drop off other accepted electronics for recycling.
